Students to push for Gun Control during Leadership Conference

During the <u>USPAK foundation</u> 4th Annual Youth Leadership Conference participating high school and college students will push for the important issue of **"Gun Control"** facing our nation at Capitol Hill.

This year conference "Shaping Your Future" will take place from June 22nd to 25th 2013 at American University, Washington DC. One important feature of this year conference is to prepare our youth on how to reach out to their Congressman or Senator on an issue important to them. At the Conference Advocacy day on Tuesday June 25 students in groups will travel to Capitol Hill, Washington DC and meet with their Congressman or Senator in their office, and push for Gun Control. It is planned that student groups will meet with about 12-15 Congressmen and Senators and share their thoughts with the elected representatives. During the first 3 days of the conference we will work to improve students messaging skills, develop talking points, thought articulation, and how to interact with US Congressman or Senator.

In addition to the above, students will participate in

- Tutorials & Workshops on Problem solving, peace building, bullying
- Develop networking, time management, resume writing, public speaking and interviewing skills
- Career guidance workshops, resume review
- College admissions, Essay review
- Interfaith community service project
- Talent Show and dinner at Pakistan Embassy

Advance skill development modules are planned for returning students who have attended previous conferences. Separate panel discussion sessions are planned for parents attending the conference.

President Obama Speaks at AAPI Heritage Month Celebration



President Obama <u>delivered remarks</u> to over 200 members of the Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) community at a White House celebration of AAPI Heritage Month. The audience included national, state, and local community leaders; elected officials; leaders of philanthropic, youth, and arts organizations; and members of the President's Administration, including Sri Srinivasan, who was <u>recently confirmed unanimously</u> by the Senate to become the first South Asian American federal appeals court judge.

In his remarks, the President highlighted the contributions of generations of Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders who, in his words, "helped build this country, and helped to defend this country, and to make America what it is today." Four Wildcards That Could Make or Break Pakistan's New Government – Michael Kugelman

Pakistan's new government takes office this week, and optimism is in the air.

Pundits point to the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz's (PML-N) resounding election victory on May 11, and <u>suggest</u> it will use this mandate to implement critically necessary policy reforms. Presumptive prime minister Nawaz Sharif, observers <u>insist</u>, is more mellow and mature than he was during his previous terms as prime minister. They cite his post-election conciliatory moves-from a visit to the hospital bed of political rival Imran Khan to an <u>invitation</u> to Indian Prime Minister Manmohan Singh to attend Sharif's swearing-in ceremony.

Some of this optimism is warranted. But let's be realistic: despite Pakistan's political transition, the nation's troubling structural realities-from reform-resistant vested interests to state-sponsored support for militancy-remain entrenched. We should therefore keep our expectations in check, and hope for relatively modest achievements from Islamabad's new leadership. These include improving the economy, stabilizing civil-military ties, and maintaining adequate relations with India and the United States. Success, however, will hinge on four unpredictable factors. A Turning Point for Pakistan? - Bruce O. Riedel

Pakistan's internal security situation is grim. This is a country literally under siege since September 11. Some 45,000 Pakistanis have been killed by terrorism and militant-related violence, and the election process that just ended was marked by a considerable amount of bloodshed. Over the years, the Pakistanis have allowed the development of a terrorist Frankenstein inside their own country. Successive U.S. presidents since George Bush senior have warned Pakistan that tolerating and even patronizing terrorist groups would sooner or later come home to haunt them. We have the consolation of being right, but not much consolation that there is any chance of improvement on the horizon. Read More
